We are guided by a Community Advisory Board (CAB) composed of clinicians, community-based organizations, Indigenous leaders and people with lived experiences.

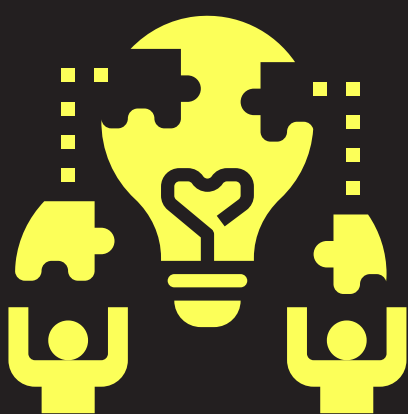
GIFTED LOCAL KNOWLEDGE

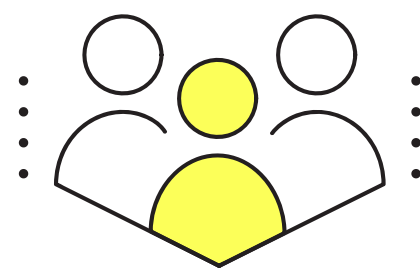
FOCUSED ON PRIORITIES

A series of learning modules are being developed around four areas identified by the CAB as priorities for Saskatchewan: Indigenous ways of knowing, prevention, testing and linkage to care.



HONOURING OUR STORIES

We produced Rivers of Hope, a documentary-style video of stories about the historical and cultural context of HIV/HCV programming in Saskatchewan.



SEEING WITH TWO EYES

We designed an etuaptmumk (Two-eyed Seeing) evaluation framework and toolkit for evaluating HIV/HCV practices from both Western and Indigenous perspectives.



EVALUATION

Impacts of this project on Community-Based Organizations (n=12):

- ↑ Knowledge of HIV/HCV PPIs by 52%.
- ↑ Application of this knowledge in community programming by 55%.
